Brussels celebrates Bavaria – and Europe

The esplanade at Parc du Cinquantenaire—a culturally significant site in the beating heart of Brussels, easily reached via the direct link to Merode metro station—will transform from October 14th to 25th 2025 into a festival ground celebrating Bavarian joie de vivre, European diversity, and economic exchange. Oktoberfest Brussels 2025 brings people, markets, and ideas together across national borders.

This year's festival is entirely devoted to inter-European dialogue: between Bavaria and Belgium, business and politics, tradition and the future. With a varied supporting program, culinary authenticity, and Bavarian music, it's not just about celebration, but also about networking.

It also assists Eric Beißwenger, Bavarian State Minister for European and International Affairs, in all matters relating to Europe. In addition to handling subject-specific issues, the Representation organizes events on various EU and cultural topics and maintains an extensive network with EU institutions, the business sector, academia, and other regions of Europe.

Albert-Henri de Merode

Albert-Henri de Merode brings over 15 years of experience in organizing and staging large-scale events. His most celebrated production is undoubtedly the romantic Christmas market at Merode Castle, which draws over 80,000 visitors and was named "Germany's coziest Christmas market" in 2024.

As a graduate engineer and architect, he has served as project manager on numerous construction projects in Germany and Belgium, with a focus on site coordination and client representation—beginning with the building of the Free State of Bavaria's Representation to the European Union.

He is also active in voluntary work, serving as President of the Belgian-Bavarian Society and of the European Community of Historical Marksmen, and he takes part in Brussels folklore by portraying Emperor Charles V in the Ommegang procession. Thanks to his many years of professional and volunteer activity in both countries, he feels equally at home in Bavaria and in Belgium.
